General Codes of Conduct and Safety Plan

1. The driver of the vehicle must hold a current Australian Drivers licence or permit and drive under the licence conditions.
2. All vehicles must be road registered and comply with regulations while in the Tracks, Treks, Outings.
3. Respect the rights of others to use and share the road space.
4. Keep a safe distance between vehicles - acknowledge that increased weight and tyre choice can affect braking distance.
5. Take care when reversing - check blind spots and ensure that no one has walked behind your vehicle before you reverse.
6. Be aware of vision limitations and be particularly observant near children to avoid accidents.
7. Keep to approved vehicle corridors and tracks. On beaches and unvegetated sand areas, drive only where permitted.
8. Alpine areas, swamps and vegetated dunes are easily damaged. Avoid them.
9. Respect our wildlife. Stop and look, but never disturb or chase animals. It can affect their survival.
10. Keep to restrictions on use of public land. Respect national parks and other conservation areas.
11. Get permission before driving on private land. Leave livestock alone and gates as found.
12. Keep your vehicle clean and in good mechanical condition to reduce the environmental impact.
13. Take adequate water, food, fuel, and spares on trips. In remote areas travel with another vehicle.
14. Help in bushfire emergencies and search and rescue if you are properly equipped and able.
15. NO smoking in cars where children are travelling, in the amenity blocks. Butts must not be dropped on the ground.
16. Animals, pets, dogs can enter the Tracks, Treks, Outings providing they are on a lead. Please ensure no dogs' poo at campsites and on tracks and keep your dog/s quiet. No pets allowed in the amenity's blocks.
17. Keep the environment clean take home all your garbage and broken equipment maybe other peoples too.
18. Noise music and loud speaking must be reduced in camp after dark consider other campers may be trying to sleep.
19. No glass, cans, or non-burnable materials to be put into campfires or thrown into the bush.
